

Sporties Supports 321 Ride

'I thought I would teach my son about the world it turns out I need to teach the world about my son'. They see a little boy who can talk, I see a miracle who is beyond words.

The Sporties has contributed financially to the now Annual '321 Ride for Down Syndrome'.

In 2015 321 Ride event Organiser Paul Quinane launched the first '321 Ride for Down Syndrome' which is in affect a 321km bicycle ride over 3 days around Northern and Central Victoria. The purpose of the ride is to raise awareness, acceptance and 'inclusiveness' of people living with Down Syndrome.

On Monday 20th March this year the participating riders set off from outside the Sporties main doors to complete the 321km trek.

The riders were decked out in their new uniforms to help people take notice of the group of volunteers and the reason for the ride as they moved from town to town along the route.

Funds raised from the ride in the past couple of years have been donated to not only Down Syndrome Victoria, but directly to our community in support of the Cobram Special School for their educational projects for their Junior Area. One of these projects is the resurgence in their Bike Education Program.

The riders travelled through Katunga, Moama, Echuca, Rushworth, Nagambie, Shepparton, Numurkah and back to the Sporties (321 km's).

The significance of the 321 ride was to align with the 3rd month and the 21st day which is World Down Syndrome Day. This date is chosen simply because the most common form of Down Syndrome is when the 21st chromosome splits into 3 rather than 2.

Paul rates this year's ride as the best to date 'This year we had the most number of riders taking part in the ride and it was also the most successful financially!'

Congratulations to Paul and those riders that took part along with the road crew etc. on this fantastic initiative and extremely worthy cause.
